Edderton Community Hall

Two new Trustees were elected at the Management Meeting on June 8th to bring the total number of trustees to six. The newly appointed trustees had been recruited to take over the roles of Treasurer and Secretary. At the same meeting a review of charges for the hire of the Hall was undertaken. It was agreed that charges should cover costs and take into account cleaning and energy consumption, but still be an attractive and competitive rate. The new charges, which came into immediate effect, are:

Small Hall	£8.00 an hour
Large Hall	£12.00 an hour
Both Halls	£20.00 an hour
Weddings	£300.00

Bookings by local residents for private and community events would attract a 25% discount.

Timber Extraction

Work on the construction of a new forestry track to link Casandamff Woodland to the Struie Road (B9176) has now been completed. Removal of timber is now awaited. Fountains Forestry has indicated that the initial extraction will relate to wind blown trees. From sounds heard on Tuesday, August 16th, work on the fallen trees has now started. It is to be hoped that the footpath through the woodland will remain accessible throughout the timber felling operations and subsequent clearance.

Community Broadband

Over the summer months many residents living further than 2km from the telephone exchange experienced difficulties with broadband, which has been intermittent and at times very slow. Despite claims from governments and BT to the effect that many more subscribers now receive superfast broadband, it does seem that many places in the North of Scotland are being overlooked.

The prospect of a Community Broadband scheme being set up using a radio connection is still being pursued by the Kyle of Sutherland Development Trust (KoSDT), as well as by Highlands and Islands Enterprise (HIE). Recent contacts with both KoSDT and HIE have revealed that both organisations are waiting for BT to announce the postcodes of areas that BT is prepared to release for a Community Broadband provision. The postcodes were expected in March, but BT has not yet managed to produce this information.

Land Rovers in Edderton

Coire Na Cloiche Wind Farm

Work on the construction of the Coire Na Cloiche Windfarm will begin from August 8th, and proceed on a gradual basis. This will include 4-5 weeks of light preparatory site work during the autumn months, though without any significant disturbances to public roads.

Full-scale construction is scheduled to start on April 1st, 2017 and end in September 2018, with work only taking place in the second and third quarters of each year.

The Coire Na Cloiche Wind Farm looks forward to a fine co-operation with Highland Council, as well as with community councils, neighbours and the wind farm community group.

The Easter Ross Deer Management Group

The Easter Ross Deer Management Group (ERDMG) has just completed its new Management Plan. This important document sets out an effective strategy for the management of wild deer across the Group's area.

The full Management Plan can be viewed on the Website Group's new at www.deermanagement.co.uk, which is hosted by the Association of Deer Management Groups. The site itself is rather bare at the moment, but will be added to substantially in the very near future, in order to provide much more information, and to encourage interaction between the Group and the Community. The Plan itself is a weighty document, but a good starting point for anyone interested in the subject. Do click onto the site, view the map and click onto the Easter Ross section. This will take you directly to the Plan.

Wild deer have had a unique place in the history and culture of our Upland areas. Red deer in particular are a truly iconic species. The area included within the Plan extends to some 20,000 hectares and clear maps illustrate this. There are differing land types, but the area is principally made up of open heather moorland, woodland and some improved farmland.

The Plan outlines the principal aims and objectives of each of the participating estates as well as the Group's overall objectives arrived at by a collaborative approach, and with support from Scottish Natural Heritage, who recently carried out a helicopter count of the current population of Red deer.

The Plan also highlights the need for a collaborative approach to deer management, the financial implications, the need to ensure sustainable environmental methods and to explain to the wider Community how this is carried out.

We really do want to engage with those who live in the area, local businesses, organisations and schools, with an aim to strengthen the economic benefits, deliver the maximum public benefit and to improve the management of the deer and the habitats within which they live.
